The height variance has been approved! Fisher Architecture's newest hotel design is a sixty-five-unit hotel named Tapestry Collection by Hilton in Fenwick Island, DE. The town's appeal board voted to approve the developer's request for a variance to exceed the town's height limit at the property on Coastal Highway. The team was requested to coordinate between the brand standards and the local Coastal Delaware Beach architecture. Many exciting amenities and an updated modern interior are just some of the features guests can expect. Construction is expected to begin in the Winter of 2018.



Under Construction! Fisher Architecture provided architecture designs and construction drawings for the Coventry Square Apartments in Salisbury, MD. There are thirteen buildings totaling two hundred and eighty-eight apartments. Residents can choose from one, two- or three-bedroom units. The community also includes a three thousand eight hundred square foot recreational building with a fitness room, Great room, Cyber Café, full size kitchen and leasing office. Other amenities include a large outdoor pool and deck, garages, tennis court, and a playground.

HYATT PLACE-OCEAN CITY

The Hyatt Place in Ocean City is complete and open for business!

Fisher Architecture was hired to provide full services, including interior design, for this eight-story, one hundred eleven unit hotel located in Ocean City, MD. The original building was demolished to create a new hotel complete with boardwalk retail. The spacious guest-rooms all have balconies with an ocean or bay view. There are indoor and outdoor swimming pools, an oversized fitness center, fifteen hundred square feet of meeting space, and a coffee to cocktails bar with a veranda that overlooks the Atlantic Ocean.

The design of the building requires that its shadows not cast larger than a five story structure. The team provided a feasibility study very early on that resulted in the owners obtaining more density than originally anticipated. Fisher Architecture understood the zoning code at a high level, finding ways to increase the project density.
