This brand new 10,000 square foot commercial building will be added to the residential townhouse community Sea Oaks Village located in West Ocean City, Maryland! The new mixed-use space will provide spaces for contractor shops and storage. Fisher Architecture has provided full architectural design and construction documents for a repeat client. The project has been approved by the Planning Commission and is currently in for permit. This rendered building is phase one of what is planned to be a total of multiple phases to include retail and professional office spaces.

Architecture provided architectural construction design and documents to update the exterior façade of the existing building. This will include EIFS, stone, and awning upgrades as well as making the both buildings functional and aesthetic. The team was tasked with keeping current roof and building over the existing structure in order to achieve the desired look. Hired previously by the same owner to design the renovations the 1305 S. Salisbury, the owner wishes to combine the
